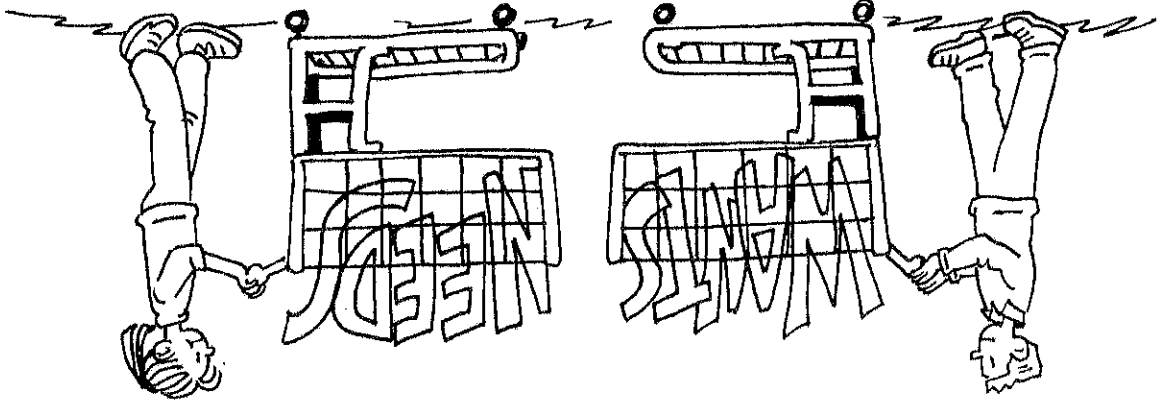


Decision Time

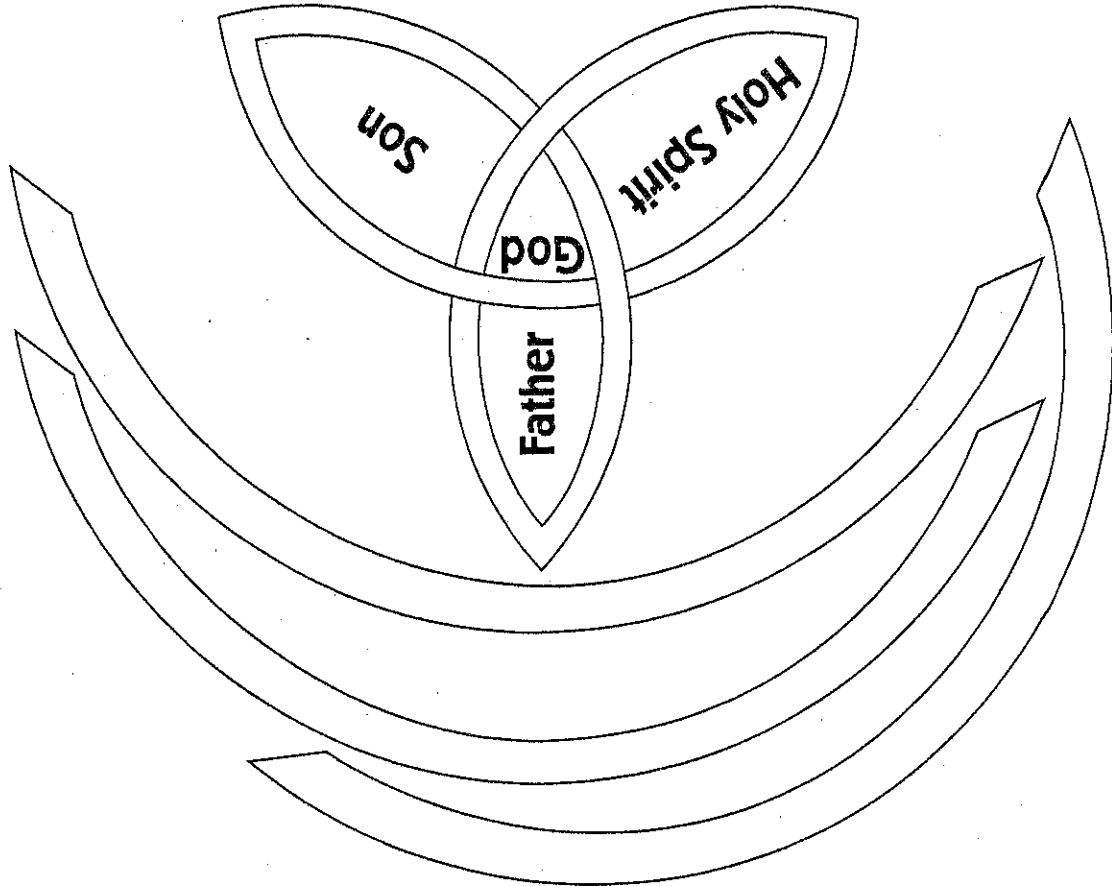

In the Holy Trinity, God shows himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Many churches decorate their walls and windows with symbols of the Holy Trinity. Follow the directions below to make a symbol of the Holy Trinity that you can display in your home.

Draw three arcs like the three arcs below on a piece of paper. Color each arc a different color. Cut out the arcs. Arrange them as shown in the sample to create the Trinity symbol. Glue them to a piece of construction paper. Print "God" in the small, center opening. Print "Father," "Son," and "Holy Spirit" in the 3 larger openings. Write a prayer to the Holy Trinity under the symbol.
